Two weeks before the U.S. presidential elections, AmCham Slovakia hosted a unique bipartisan discussion on the future of U.S. leadership. Our two experienced speakers, one representing Democratic, and the other one the Republican perspective, dived into the key topics defining these elections. They covered the key economic issues, global megatrends, and what lies ahead for U.S.-EU relations, as well as ties with China and Russia.

One intriguing observation concerned the lack of unity and common greater goals, and stronger division lines. In the past, Republicans and Democrats would meet informally to discuss expert matters and seek common ground. The nation's well-being held greater importance than political ambitions. However, in today's age of likes, views, and followers, this is no longer the case, and expertise is often overshadowed by popularity. This event offered a great opportunity to discuss how the next U.S. administration could shape both national and global policy.
