When workplace dynamics take a negative turn, things can quickly spiral—ranging from unethical behavior and silent discrimination to toxic environments, eroded trust, underperformance, or even quiet quitting.

In an insightful discussion, expert speakers shared how to recognize warning signs and when to intervene. They emphasized that workplace investigations often go beyond fraud or

policy violations, frequently beginning when trust starts to erode. Drawing on real case studies, legal insights, and practical experience, the panelists provided valuable guidance on promoting psychological safety, fostering trust-building, maintaining corporate ethics, and managing reputation.

The conversation underscored the complexity of conducting workplace investigations, highlighting their importance in addressing deeper issues and maintaining a healthy, productive work environment.

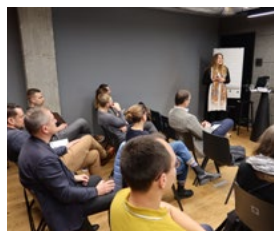

With the Construction Act, in place for nearly 50 years, officially ceasing to apply on April 1, 2025, this event brought together industry professionals to introduce the new Construction Law and its executive decrees, focusing on their impact on ongoing and future projects.

Tatiana Prokopová of Squire Patton Boggs, Chair of AmCham's Construction Law Task Force, led the seminar, outlining key legislative changes and

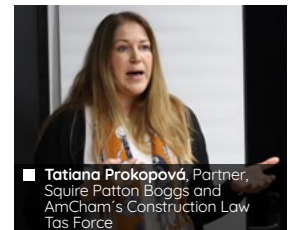
providing a comprehensive overview of the new legal framework.

The new law aims to streamline construction processes, enhance professionalism in state administration, and reduce administrative burdens for businesses. Discussions covered permitting procedures, digitalization, and new design documentation standards, offering valuable insights into Slovakia's construction landscape in 2025.
