AmCham Slovakia's General Assembly 2026 offered a review of the achievements and results from the previous year, the announcement of the results of the Board of Directors elections, and the most supportive member companies.

AmCham President Martin Maštálir reflected on a year marked by rapid economic, technological, and geopolitical change. Against this backdrop, AmCham's activities in 2025 were united under the theme of competitiveness, emphasizing Slovakia's ability to attract talent, investment, innovation, and high-value business opportunities.

The General Assembly highlighted the continued growth and relevance of the chamber, which now represents more than 330 member companies employing over 115,000 people and contributing significantly to the Slovak economy. Throughout 2025, AmCham remained actively engaged in public policy discussions, legislative processes, and stakeholder dialogue, providing expert input on issues ranging from healthcare and

taxation to digitalization, education, sustainability, labor legislation, and the rule of law.

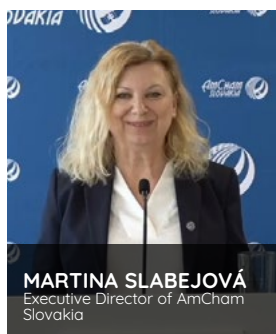
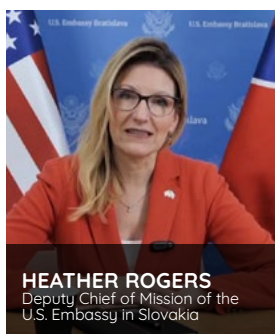
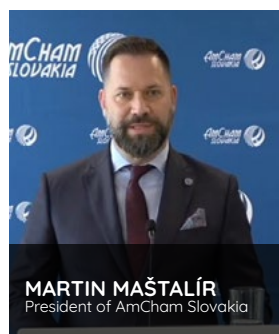
Members also received an overview of AmCham's extensive event portfolio. During 2025, the chamber organized more than 70 events attended by nearly 5,000 participants. These included business breakfasts, seminars, networking events, conferences, workshops, executive roundtables, and regional initiatives. Flagship events such as Future Ready Slovakia, the Business Centers Conference, and the ESG in Transition

Conference provided platforms for dialogue on competitiveness, innovation, sustainability, and future economic development.

One of the highlights of the General Assembly was the recognition of AmCham's Top 10 Supporters, member companies whose long-term engagement, expertise, and partnership significantly contribute to the chamber's mission. Beyond financial support, these organizations play an essential role in driving policy discussions, sharing know-how, supporting educational initiatives, and strengthening cooperation between the business community, government, academia, and civil society. Their commitment helps ensure that AmCham can continue delivering impactful advocacy, meaningful events, and valuable opportunities for its members.

Looking ahead, the chamber confirmed that competitiveness will remain at the heart of its activities in 2026. Three cross-cutting themes will shape its work: strengthening trust and predictability in the business environment, supporting technological progress and innovation, and contributing to a data-driven competitiveness agenda ahead of Slovakia's next electoral cycle.

The General Assembly reaffirmed that AmCham's success is built on collaboration. By connecting businesses, institutions, experts, and regional stakeholders, the chamber continues to help create conditions for a more competitive, innovative, and prosperous Slovakia.
